Language Education for the Global Citizen and Metrolingual Approach

Beyond Purilingualism

Abstract

The importance of incorporating culture in the foreign language education has long been adovocated by many scholars, but there are common challenges for their approaches. In this article, I first review the concept of plurilingalism proposed in the CEFR (Common European Framewok of Reference for Languages) and point out its challenges of how they view the concept of language and culture. I then introduce two visions that will possibly overcome the challenges of plurilingiualism; metorilingalism (Pennycook & Otsuji, 2010) and language education for the global citizen (Sato & Kumagai, 2011). Finally I show an example of how we can encorporate these visions into the Japanese language curriculum.
